The past year has been an amazing one for Seeing Eye Dogs, which wouldn't have been possible without the support of people like you!

In the past 12 months we matched 42 handlers with a Seeing Eye Dog, the fourth straight year we have matched more than 40 handlers with a dog. Across the last year, we had 235 active Seeing Eye Dog handlers across Australia, the most we've ever had at one time!

The future is also bright for Seeing Eye Dogs, with our wait time for a Seeing Eye Dog now down to just five months, while another 200 puppies have entered the Seeing Eye Dogs program.

Excitingly, we also opened the brand-new Dog Care Centre at our Seeing Eye Dogs headquarters. The new facility, completely donor-funded, means our workforce and dogs now enjoy an industry leading welfare facility.

Thayana, from Perth, was matched with Seeing Eye Dog Shayla in October 2023. Thayana lost most of her vision in her late teens, but as she had been in Australia on a student visa, believed she wasn't eligible for a Seeing Eye Dog.

After returning to Perth from a trip to South Africa, Thayana decided to explore what support was available, and was deemed eligible to receive a Seeing Eye Dog.

"I knew that I didn't want to come back the same person that I was. I used to depend on friends to go everywhere and anywhere." Thayana said.

"The biggest impact Shayla's had is giving me my independence back, I'm able to leave my house and go somewhere I want to now."
